Rohnert Park - Q 2 2026 Highlights

- **Community-Driven Priorities**
 - Continued Community Coffee & Chats bringing residents and City leadership together for conversations about local priorities, public safety, infrastructure, and the City budget.
- **Infrastructure That Delivers**
 - Advancing the Sewer I&I Reduction Phase 2 Project to improve system reliability and protect critical infrastructure.
 - Continued investment in street pavement maintenance and roadway improvements throughout the city.
 - Broke ground and nearing completion of the City Center Solar Canopy Project to support sustainability and long-term operational efficiency.
- **Parks & Quality of Life**
 - Pride Flag Raising Ceremony celebrated inclusion, belonging, and the diversity that strengthens our community.
 - Public Works Week recognized the dedicated employees who maintain the infrastructure and services residents rely on every day, highlighted by a staff appreciation barbecue and community recognition.
 - Bike Month activities encouraged active transportation and community connection.
 - Alicia Park Playground Improvement Project advancing toward construction, bringing new inclusive play opportunities for local families.
- **Community Recognition**
 - Proclamations recognizing Bike Month, Public Service Recognition Week, Public Works Week, Affordable Housing Month, and the volunteers of Rohnert Park Animal Services.
 - Recognition of Aaron Johnson for 39 years of dedicated service to the City of Rohnert Park.
 - Celebration of Municipal Clerks Week 2026.
- **Code Enforcement Efforts**
 - Code Compliance cases declined 13.3%, reflecting successful early intervention and proactive problem-solving.
 - Shopping cart blight cases decreased 25.6%, permit violations dropped 78.4%, and environmental and health-related cases fell 59.6%.
 - Continued focus on neighborhood quality, responsiveness, and community standards across the city.
- **Community Partnerships & Innovation**
 - Celebrated the opening of the Community Garden at Cross and Crown Lutheran Church which will support local food security and fresh produce donations to the Noah Food Pantry, made possible by a \$5,000 grant from the Rohnert Park Foundation.
 - Launched a Health To Go vending machine at the Peoples Service Center, 6800 Hunter Dr, Ste B, Rohnert Park, expanding access to free public health and wellness resources.
 - Became home to California's first automated Drop+Go recycling pod, advancing sustainability and convenient CRV recycling.

This year, instead of bringing in outside food vendors, every post-ride meal was prepared by a Windsor restaurant and covered through rider registration. Downtown restaurants served more than 1,000 of those meals – and that's before counting all the families, spectators, and festival-goers who packed the Town Green throughout the weekend.

Council Directs Staff to Prepare Sales Tax Measure for November Ballot

On June 3, Council received an update from staff on the Town's Mid-Year Financial Update, the appropriations limit for 2026-27, and preliminary framework of a FY 2027-29 Biennial Budget. This was followed by a presentation on fiscal analysis, background materials, and draft ballot language related to a potential November 2026 one cent Transactions and Use Tax measure.
